Re: Pleora Packaging Compliance

Pleora's packaging complies with the "Directive on Packaging and Packaging Waste" (94/62 / EC) issued on December 15, 1994 and the subsequent revised edition:

Pleora packaging suppliers have deemed environmental compliance as follows:

The EU standard refers to many recycling mandates applicable to member states and these are not applicable to our packaging materials.

**Reduction of Toxics in Packaging:**

Based on information from our suppliers, the packaging materials used by Pleora comply with the following requirements:

- Regulated metals – lead, mercury, cadmium and hexavalent chromium – were not intentionally added to any package or packaging component during the manufacturing process.
- The sum of the incidental concentration levels of lead, mercury, cadmium and hexavalent chromium present in any package or package component does not exceed 100 parts per million by weight.
- Materials were not used to replace the heavy metals present in a quantity or manner that creates a hazard as great or greater than the hazard created by the regulated metals.

Please note, Pleora does not conduct separate testing on these packaging items and relies on compliance information received from our suppliers.
